India’s top 500 listed firms have only nine women CEOs

India's top 500 listed companies continue to have limited representation of women in senior leadership, with only nine women serving as chief executive officers (CEOs) and 25 as managing directors (MDs), according to data presented by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) in the Lok Sabha. Minister of State for Corporate Affairs Harsh Malhotra, replying to a question from Trinamool Congress MP Saayoni Ghosh, said on Monday the figures were based on filings in the MCA21 database for the top 500 listed companies by turnover.

According to the data, the top 500 listed companies had 860 women directors or board members overall. This included 18 additional directors, 738 directors, 25 managing directors, 12 nominee directors and 67 whole-time directors. The companies had only nine women CEOs and 22 women

chief financial officers (CFOs). Women's participation is much broader across the overall corporate universe. According to data, 1.16 million women are currently associated with active companies as directors, out of a total of 3.9 million directors across the country. India currently has 2.14 million active companies and 506,000 active limited liability partnerships (LLPs) across the states.

Vibha Padalkar of HDFC Life, Vishakha Mulye of Aditya Birla Capital, Priya Nair of Hindustan Unilever, Praveena Rai of Multi Commodity Exchange of

India, who earlier served as CEO of National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), Prabha Narasimhan of Colgate-Palmolive (India) and Jasleen Kohli of Digit Insurance are among the prominent women MDs and CEOs in the country. Malhotra also said that no assessment had been carried out on the barriers to the progression of women directors. While the statutory framework requires certain companies to

have at least one woman director, the ministry had not separately assessed the barriers affecting the progression of

women directors.

The minister also said that no new policy interventions, targets or incentives are currently under consideration to improve gender diversity in corporate governance, citing the existing statutory framework as sufficient. The Companies Act, 2013, does not define the position of "Chairperson" or "Chief Technology Officer". As a result, the ministry said it does not maintain data on these categories.

The number of orders rose from two in 2021-22 to 10 in 2022-23 and peaked at 19 in 2023-24. It subsequently declined to 11 in 2024-25 and eight in 2025-26. The data provides a picture of how compliance with the women-director requirement has been enforced over the past five years.

The Companies Act, 2013, and the Companies (Appointment and Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014, require every listed company and every unlisted public company having paid-up share capital of ₹100 crore or more, or turnover of ₹300 crore or more, to appoint at least one woman director on its board.

Assam floodwaters recede, leave behind trail of loss, destruction

Santak village in the foothills of the Naga Hills near Bihubar in Assam's Sivasagar district is known for its lush green tea gardens and scenic mountains. Life was normal in this tribal hamlet until the Dikhow river, a tributary of the Brahmaputra, and continuous rain unleashed their fury last week, claiming lives and livelihoods.

When *Business Standard* spoke to 66-year-old Ashok Agarwalla from Santak, he could barely talk, the trauma of a close escape from a disaster zone and concerns of losing the earnings of a lifetime were evident in his voice. "I was born in 1960 and have lived here ever since. I had a grocery shop and a house behind it. All of it has been washed away. We could not even save a single piece of cloth," said Agarwalla.

This is not just the story of one Agarwalla, but thousands of people in flood-hit Assam, where the death toll has already touched 101. More than 0.14 million people have been displaced across seven districts, with over 450 villages inundated and 11,933.46 hectares of crop area damaged. An unprecedented crisis that, according to old-timers, districts in upper Assam have never seen before. "Not in my life of 84 years have I seen such floods in Sivasagar. Almost the entire town was under floodwaters," said 85-year-old Devi Bagaria.

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday said that over ₹1,000 crore is likely to be required for repairing damaged properties and rehabilitating flood-affected families. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has assured full assistance, Sarma said.

Sivasagar most hit

Sivasagar was among the worst-hit districts, with around 46 deaths, District Commissioner Mridul Yadav told *Business Standard*. Rescue and relief operations are almost over and rehabilitation of affected families has begun, while an assessment of economic losses is under way.

But for residents, the crisis does not end when the water starts receding. Homes have to be cleaned of layers of mud, belongings have to be salvaged, and families have to find a place to stay while waiting for rehabilitation. The flood also leaves behind hidden losses: Ruined crops, broken livelihoods, and sometimes land that may never recover.

The experience of Sivasagar also points to a larger problem:

Assam's floods are increasingly being shaped by multiple factors rather than a single spell of heavy rainfall. Nearly 40 per cent of Assam's land area is flood-prone, while the Brahmaputra continuously shifts its course, erodes riverbanks, and alters floodplains.

A Climate Trends report describes the phenomenon as "compound flooding", where intense rainfall in Assam, heavy precipitation in upstream catchments across Arunachal Pradesh, Bhutan and Tibet, snow and glacier melt, swollen tributaries, erosion and landslides interact to produce larger and prolonged floods.

Kartiki Negi, climate impacts lead at Climate Trends and author of the report, said Assam was witnessing sharp

intraseasonal variations in rainfall, with periods of intense rain interspersed with prolonged breaks. "We have been witnessing sharp intraseasonal variations in the rainfall patterns; either the rainfall is very intense or break-monsoon periods are quite long, triggering extreme weather events. This is direct impact of global warming," Negi said.

G P Sharma, president of meteorology & climate change at Skymet Weather, said the ongoing week will pick up heavy to very heavy rains, particularly in the upper Assam region, already ravaged by recent floods. According to Sharma, the recent floods were not primarily due to excessive rainfall, but rather owing to excess flow of water from the Brahmaputra and the other tributaries in the nearby regions.

More than a rainfall problem

Climate change is only one part of Assam's vulnerability. The Brahmaputra's high sediment load, shifting channels, and seasonal flooding also make the state particularly prone to erosion.

Since 1950, Assam has lost nearly 4.27 lakh hectares to erosion — about 7.4 per cent of its geographical area — according to the report.

The impact of flood extends beyond homes, disrupting agriculture, tea plantations, fisheries, transport, and livelihoods, while erosion permanently removes productive land.

These losses rarely appear in a single number. They are spread across a shop that cannot reopen, a crop that cannot be harvested, a house that needs to be rebuilt, and a piece of land that a family can no longer call its own.

TEAMLEASE SERVICES' FESTIVE SEASON WORKFORCE REPORT 2026

Tier-I cities gain share of festival season workforce

Tier-I cities are gaining share of India's festival-season frontline workforce at the expense of Tier-II and Tier-III cities as the expansion of e-commerce (ecom) and quick-commerce (qcom) dark stores concentrates organised hiring in larger urban markets, according to TeamLease Services' Festive Season Workforce Report 2026, released on Wednesday.

The share of frontline workforce in Tier-I cities is estimated

to be 40.5 per cent in 2026, from 38.2 per cent in 2025 and 33.1 per cent in 2024. Tier-II and Tier-III cities, meanwhile, see their proportional shares decline despite an increase in absolute headcount, the report said. The shift is attributed to the rapid expansion of ecom and qcom dark-store networks in Tier-I hubs, where hyper-local demand is concentrated. The report is based on anonymised employment records of around 60,000 frontline associates across consumer durables, organised retail, ecom, qcom, logistics and fast-moving con-

sumer goods, covering demographics, regional deployment, city-tier concentration, job roles and monthly CTC (cost to company) benchmarks.

According to the report, temporary hiring across organised retail, e-com, qcom, logistics, FMCG and consumer durables is expected to grow 15-20 per cent this festive season. TeamLease expects percentage growth in hiring to be higher in southern and western markets than in the north and east, although absolute hiring is expected to increase.

"This market share diver-

gence was largely driven by the explosive scaling of ecom and qcom dark-store networks in Tier-I hubs, where hyper-local demand is concentrated. Conversely, in Tier-III markets, limited qcom infrastructure, combined with the fact that a vast majority of festival spending remains anchored in unorganised, local, or non-formalised retail stores, which do not rely on structured staffing meant that despite absolute headcount growth, Tier-II and Tier-III's proportional workforce share adjusted downward," the report noted.

New entity to speed up cluster dvpt projects

The Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) administration has decided to establish a dedicated special purpose entity-Thane Cluster Development & Area Improvement Company Limited (TCDAILC) - under its direct control to ensure effective implementation of various cluster development schemes. A detailed proposal regard-

ing the formation of the company will be tabled for approval during the General Body Meeting scheduled for August 17.

Thane city has a significant number of old, dangerous, and unauthorized buildings. Every monsoon, incidents of building collapses pose severe threats to life and property, continuously bringing the urgent need for redevelopment into focus. The Cluster Development Scheme was introduced to provide

safe, legally owned, permanent housing to citizens currently living in hazardous structures.

Ground-level construction work under the scheme has already commenced in the Kisan Nagar area, while pre-development work is underway in several other parts of the city.

So far, 51 Urban Renewal Plans (URPs) have been prepared within the municipal limits.

While CIDCO is currently executing certain cluster plans, TMC plans to directly function as the implementing agency for the remaining layouts.

Under this initiative, the newly formed company will directly oversee and execute selected urban renewal cluster plans across Thane. The municipal commissioner will decide which cluster plans will be executed.

Maha ATS seizes 4.7 kg of crystal meth, 1 held

The Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) has seized 4.718 kg of methamphetamine, a synthetic drug commonly known as crystal meth, valued at around ₹9.4 crore.

The probe began with a seizure in Mumbai and led the agency to an alleged clandestine manufacturing unit in Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh. One person has been arrested, while two foreign women named as co-accused are absconding, officials said.

The first seizure was made on Tuesday near Amber Hotel in Bandra East after the ATS's Kalachowki unit received information that a man was arriving in the area to sell a

consignment of methamphetamine. Acting on the tip-off, the team laid a trap and intercepted the accused.

A search of his possession led to the recovery of around 2.05 kg of methamphetamine, valued at approximately ₹4 crore, officials said. Following the seizure, the Kalachowki police registered a case against the accused under the relevant provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

During custodial interrogation, investigators extracted crucial leads indicating that the synthetic drugs had been procured directly from a production facility located in Greater Noida. Pursuing the supply trail, an ATS team travelled to

Uttar Pradesh and, with the assistance of local UP police, executed a raid on the target premises.

The search resulted in the seizure of another 2.668 kg of methamphetamine, valued at approximately ₹5.4 crore, officials said. Material allegedly used for manufacturing the drug was also seized from the premises.

The ATS has now begun probing the source of the raw material, the manufacturing process and the alleged supply chain through which the drug was transported to Mumbai for distribution.

Further investigation is underway to identify other persons involved in the procurement, manufacture, transportation and sale of the contraband.

CIDCO to offer 4,779 EWS homes

The City and Industrial Development Corporation (CIDCO) has announced a new housing scheme offering 4,779 homes for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), with online registration set to begin at 11 am on August 15.

The homes will be offered across three locations - 4,229 units at Talaja Sector 39, 257 at Kalamboli Bus Depot and 293 at Kharghar Bus Depot. A portion of the inventory has been reserved for applicants with disabilities. The three locations have road, rail and metro connectivity and are also located close to the Navi Mumbai International Airport.

The prices of individual homes and all applicable charges will be published on CIDCO's housing portal before registration begins.

Applicants with an annual family income of up to ₹6 lakh and who do not own a pucca house anywhere in India will be eligible to apply.

5 detained for 'anti-India' posts

The Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) detained five youths from Malad, Parel, Mumbra and Padgha on Tuesday for questioning over alleged anti-India and provocative social media posts, officials familiar with the investigation said.

The five were released after questioning on Tuesday and asked to appear before the ATS again on Wednesday. A preliminary investigation indicated that they had allegedly been associated with different anti-establishment platforms since 2022. Sources said some of these platforms were allegedly operated by persons based outside India.

The ATS is examining the youths' backgrounds, digital footprints and previous online activities to determine whether their posts were expressions of personal views or part of an attempt to influence or provoke others.

130 dog bites or 58? KDMC raps officer

The Kalyan-Dombivli Municipal Corporation (KDMC) has issued a show-cause notice to Dr Sandeep Pagare, medical officer at Rukminibai Hospital in Kalyan, after he allegedly gave inflated figures to the media regarding patients treated for stray dog bites in the Khadakpada area.

The notice was issued by KDMC chief medical officer Dr Deepa Shukla, who confirmed the action to the FPJ. She said Dr Pagare has been asked to submit a written

explanation within 24 hours.

According to the notice, several patients from the area around Sandeep Hotel in Khadakpada, Kalyan West, had approached the hospital after being bitten by a stray dog. Hospital records showed 58 patients were treated but Dr Pagare reportedly gave the number as 110-130.

KDMC has also pointed out that officials are required to route information or media responses concerning civic matters through the department head, the municipal commissioner or the public relations department.

Woman's gold goes missing at Mumbai airport

In another incident of lost items at Mumbai airport, a Chennai woman has alleged that valuables worth ₹49,000 were stolen from her baggage after she travelled on an Air India flight from Mumbai to Chennai on July 29.

The Sahar police on August 10 registered an FIR against an unidentified person. They suspect the theft occurred while the woman's baggage was being loaded onto the aircraft.

The latest case comes amid several complaints of baggage and valuables thefts at Mumbai's domestic and international airports. Police said at least 10 such cases have been registered between January and August this year.

"There are 10 pending cases this year alone," a Sahar police official said. "The team is gathering information about loaders and other staff whose role is suspected in the crimes."

The complainant, Hajira Abutahir, 36, returned to Mumbai to pursue the complaint after reaching Chennai. She told police that two gold earrings, a floral-design gold ring and a silver anklet were missing from her baggage. She had handed over her grey suitcase and black bag at the Air India check-in counter before boarding the flight.

Cop salary scam: Ghost staff, real pay, ₹6.41 cr gone

Five people have been booked in connection with the swindle

Salaries were allegedly generated in the names of employees who did not exist and credited to their bank accounts, investigations into the ₹6.41 crore Mumbai police payroll scam have revealed.

The Mumbai Crime Branch arrested Ramkishan Goswami, former Administrative Officer of the North Regional Division, on August 12.

The fraud came to light during migration of employee records from Mumbai Police's old 'Sevarth' payroll system to new software. Officials noticed discrepancies involving employees in the North Regional Division.

A subsequent inquiry allegedly revealed that 10 persons listed in the payroll system were not serving in the Mumbai Police. Despite this, salaries were credited in their names.

The alleged fraud took place in two phases – December 2019 to February 2020 and June to September 2020. Investigators suspect fake service IDs and DCPS IDs were created to show the fictitious individuals as legitimate employees.

घाटकोपर दरडीत शेख कुटुंबाचा करुण मृत्यू ■ चार दिवसांपूर्वीच मुंबईत आलेले कुटुंब उद्ध्वस्त



मुंबई : चांगले भविष्य आणि मुलांना सुरक्षित आयुष्य मिळावे, या आशेने अवघ्या चार दिवसांपूर्वी मुंबईत आलेल्या एका कुटुंबाचे स्वप्न घाटकोपरमधील दरड दुर्घटनेने क्षणात उद्ध्वस्त केले. घाटकोपर पश्चिमेकडील अशोकनगर परिसरात दरड कोसळून एकाच कुटुंबातील चौघांचा मृत्यू झाला. मृतांमध्ये अरिफ शेख, त्यांची पत्नी मरजिना आणि त्यांची दोन चिमुकली मुले मन्मत व अबान



यांचा समावेश आहे. मूळचे जैनपूर येथील असलेले अरिफ शेख हे व्यवसायाने शिंपी होते. मुंबईत काम मिळवून कुटुंबाला चांगले जीवन देण्याच्या उद्देशाने ते पत्नी आणि दोन मुलांसह अशोकनगर येथे राहण्यासाठी आले होते. त्यांची बहीण यापूर्वीपासून याच परिसरात राहत होती. त्यामुळे मुंबईत नव्याने संसार थाटताना कुटुंबाला आधार मिळेल, अशी अपेक्षा होती.



अरिफ यांना मुंबईत काम मिळेल आणि कुटुंबाची आर्थिक परिस्थिती सुधारेल, असा विश्वास होता. मुलांच्या भविष्यासाठी त्यांनी मुंबईची वाट धरली होती. त्यांच्या पत्नी मरजिनाही पतीला आर्थिक हातभार लागावा यासाठी घरकामासोबत मिळेल ते छोटे-मोठे काम करण्याच्या विचारात होत्या. मात्र, मुंबईत दाखल झाल्यानंतर अवघ्या चार दिवसांतच संपूर्ण कुटुंबावर काळाने घाला घातला.

वडिलांचा आक्रोश; राजावाडी रुग्णालयात शोककळा

दरड दुर्घटनेत मुलगा, सूनू आणि दोन नातवंडे गमावल्याने अरिफ यांचे टिटवाळा येथे राहणारे वडील दुःखाने कोलमडून गेले. राजावाडी रुग्णालयातील शवविच्छेदन केंद्रात मुलाच्या कुटुंबीयांचे मृतदेह पाहून त्यांचा आक्रोश हृदय पिळवटून टाकणारा होता. काही दिवसांपूर्वीच नव्या आयुष्याची सुरुवात करण्यासाठी मुंबईत आलेल्या कुटुंबावर अशी दुर्दैवी वेळ येईल, याची कल्पनाही नातेवाईकांना नव्हती. मुलांच्या भविष्यासाठी मुंबईत आलेल्या या कुटुंबाचे स्वप्न एका क्षणात मातीखाली गाडले गेले. नव्या आयुष्याची आशा घेऊन मुंबईत आलेल्या या कुटुंबाचा प्रवास अवघ्या चार दिवसांतच नियतीने संपवला.

अरिफचा मृतदेह जैनपूरला नेणार
दुर्घटनेत मृत्युमुखी पडलेल्या अरिफ शेख यांच्या कुटुंबीयांनी चौघांचेही मृतदेह त्यांच्या मूळ गावी जैनपूर, उत्तर प्रदेश येथे नेण्याची इच्छा व्यक्त केली आहे. त्यानुसार मृतदेह गावी पाठवण्यासाठी आवश्यक परवानग्या आणि प्रशासकीय प्रक्रिया पूर्ण करण्यासाठी घाटकोपर पोलिसांकडून कुटुंबीयांना मदत केली जात आहे.

धोकादायक ५० घरे रिकामी

घाटकोपर पश्चिमेकडील अशोकनगर परिसरात दरड कोसळून झालेल्या दुर्घटनेप्रकरणी घाटकोपर पोलिसांनी अकस्मात मृत्यूची नोंद केली आहे. दुर्घटनेनंतर पोलिसांनी घटनास्थळी धाव घेत अग्निशमन दलासह इतर यंत्रणांना बचावकार्यात मदत केली. या दुर्घटनेत आतापर्यंत सात मृतदेह बाहेर काढण्यात आले असून जखमींना विविध सरकारी रुग्णालयांत उपचारासाठी दाखल करण्यात आले आहे. घटनास्थळी पाहणीदरम्यान परिसरातील काही घरे धोकादायक क्षेत्रात असल्याचे निदर्शनास आले. त्यामुळे मुंबई महापालिका अधिकाऱ्यांच्या मदतीने पोलिसांनी सुमारे ५० घरे रिकामी करून नागरिकांना सुरक्षितस्थळी हलवले. बाधित कुटुंबांची महापालिकेने केलेल्या निवासव्यवस्थेत किंवा त्यांच्या नातेवाईकांच्या घरी राहण्याची व्यवस्था करण्यात आली आहे.



मुंबईत ७४ टिकाणे धोकादायक तर ४६ टिकाणे अतिधोकादायक

मुंबई : मुंबईत पावसाळ्यात दरड कोसळण्याचा धोका कायम असून शहर आणि उपनगरातील तब्बल २४९ टिकाणी दरडप्रवण भागांच्या आसपास मोठ्या प्रमाणात घरांची वस्ती आहे. यापैकी ७४ टिकाणे धोकादायक, तर ४६ टिकाणे अतिधोकादायक आहेत. मुंबईत पावसाळ्यात डोंगर उतारावरील हजारो रहिवाशांच्या जीवाला धोक्यात असून दरडीची टांगती तलवार कायम आहे. दरम्यान, मुंबईतील दरडप्रवण टिकाणांमध्ये एस वॉर्डमध्ये सर्वाधिक ११६ टिकाणे आहेत. या

वॉर्डमध्ये भांडुप, कांजूरमार्ग, विक्रोळी, नाहूर आणि पवईचा समावेश होतो. त्यापाठोपाठ एन वॉर्डमधील घाटकोपरमध्ये ३२, एल वॉर्डमधील कुर्ला, साकीनाका, असल्फा आणि चांदिवली परिसरात १७ टिकाणे आहेत. डी वॉर्डमधील मलबार हिल, वाळकेश्वर आणि गिरगाव परिसरात १५, पी उत्तर वॉर्डमधील मालाडमध्ये ११, तर जी दक्षिण वॉर्डमधील वरळी, प्रभादेवी, महालक्ष्मी आणि लोअर परळ परिसरात १० दरडप्रवण टिकाणे आहेत. एफ दक्षिण वॉर्डमधील

परळ, लालबाग, हिंदमाता, टी वॉर्डमधील मुलुंड तसेच एफ उत्तर वॉर्डमधील माटुंगा, सायन आणि वडाळा परिसरातही दरड कोसळण्याचा धोका असलेली टिकाणे आहेत. दरवर्षी भांडुप, विक्रोळी, घाटकोपर, चेंबूर, कुर्ला या भागात पावसाळ्यापूर्वी दरडप्रवण भागांची पालिका प्रशासन व एनडीआरएफकडून पाहणी केली जाते. दरडीचा धोका कसा ओळखवा, बचावकार्य आणि प्रथमोपचार कसा करावा, याबाबत स्थानिकांना मार्गदर्शन केले जाते.

डोंगर उतारावरील रहिवाशांच्या सुरक्षेसाठी संरक्षक भिंती उभारणे, डोंगर उतार सुरक्षित करणे यांसारखी कामे राज्य सरकारच्या मदतीने करण्यात येत असल्याचा दावा महापालिका प्रशासनाकडून केला जातो. मात्र दरवर्षी पावसाळ्यात मुंबईच्या विविध भागांत दरडी कोसळण्याच्या घटना घडत असल्याने या उपाययोजनांच्या परिणामकारकेतेवर प्रश्नचिन्ह निर्माण होत आहे.

प्रतीक्षानगरमध्ये गॅंझेबोचा स्लॅब कोसळला ; पाच जण जखमी

मुंबई : प्रतीक्षानगर येथील माळा गार्डन परिसरात बुधवारी सायंकाळी आसनव्यवस्थेसाठी उभारण्यात आलेल्या गॅंझेबोचा सिमेंटचा स्लॅब कोसळण्याची घटना बुधवारी सायंकाळी ४.४८ वाजण्याच्या सुमारास घडली. या घटनेत पाच जण जखमी झाले असून जखमींवर सायन रुग्णालयात उपचारासाठी दाखल करण्यात आल्याचे पालिका प्रशासनाकडून सांगण्यात आले. सायन प्रतीक्षा नगर माळा गार्डन, टी/१८ इमारतीसमोर जीआय फ्रेम आणि सिमेंटच्या स्लॅबपासून तयार करण्यात आलेली



आसनव्यवस्थेची ही रचना अचानक कोसळली. सुरुवातीला दिगाऱ्याखाली तीन ते चार जण अडकले असण्याची शक्यता व्यक्त करण्यात आली होती. मात्र, अग्निशमन दल घटनास्थळी पोहोचण्यापूर्वीच जखमींना खासगी रुग्णवाहिकांमधून सायन रुग्णालयात नेण्यात आले.

सायन रुग्णालयातील वैद्यकीय अधिकाऱ्यांकडून मिळालेल्या माहितीनुसार, या दुर्घटनेत धोंडीराम घोषकर (६५), गणपत आंबोले (७९), प्रमिला जाधव (६८), लक्ष्मी शितलिया (६५) आणि सुनीता मोरे (६४) हे पाच जण जखमी झाले आहेत. सर्व जखमींची प्रकृती स्थिर असल्याचे डॉक्टरांनी सांगितले. दरम्यान, दुर्घटनेची माहिती मिळताच अग्निशमन दल आणि संबंधित यंत्रणांनी घटनास्थळी पाहणी केली. गॅंझेबोची रचना नेमकी कोणत्या कारणांमुळे कोसळली, याबाबत तपास करीत आहेत.

दरड कोसळून ३४ वर्षांत, ३४० जणांचा मृत्यू

मुंबई : दरवर्षी पावसाळ्यात मुंबईत दरड कोसळण्याच्या घटना घडतात. गेल्या ३४ वर्षांत दरड कोसळण्याच्या घटनांमध्ये ३४० लोकांचा मृत्यू झाला तर ३०० हून अधिक जखमी झाल्याची माहिती समोर आली आहे. मुंबईतील दरडी कोसळून होणारी जीवित आणि वित्त हानी नवीन नसून मागील १५ वर्षांपासून दरडी कोसळून होणाऱ्या दुर्घटनेवर उपाययोजना करण्यासाठी राज्य सरकार गंभीर नाही.

मुंबईतील ३६ पैकी २५ मतदारसंघात २५७ टिकाण डोंगराळ भागात धोकादायक म्हणून वर्गीकृत आहे. आरटीआय कार्यकर्ते अनिल गलगली यांनी सांगितले की, या भागातील २२,४८३ झोपड्यांपैकी ९,६५७ झोपड्यांना प्राधान्याने स्थानांतरित करण्याची शिफारस मुंबई झोपडपट्टी सुधार मंडळाने राज्य शासनाला केली. यात उर्वरित झोपड्यांना टेकड्यांच्या आजूबाजूला तटबंदी बनवून

संरक्षित करण्याचे प्रस्तावित केले होते. पावसाळ्यात भूस्खलनांमुळे ३२७ टिकाणाबाबत गलगली यांनी सरकारला सतर्क केले होते. वर्ष १९९२ ते २०२६ या दरम्यान दरडी कोसळून झालेल्या दुर्घटनेत आतापर्यंत ३४० लोकांनी जीव गमावला असून ३०९ हून अधिक जखमी झाले आहेत. २०१० मध्ये सर्वसमावेशक सर्वेक्षण करणाऱ्या मुंबई झोपडपट्टी सुधार मंडळाने शिफारस केली होती आणि त्यावर वेळीच कार्यवाही झाली असती तर

डोंगराळ भागात राहणाऱ्यांच्या मृत्यूला रोखता आले असते. मंडळाचा अहवाल व गलगली यांच्या पाठपुराव्यानंतर १ सप्टेंबर २०११ रोजी तत्कालीन मुख्यमंत्री पृथ्वीराज चव्हाण यांनी कृती आराखडा तयार करण्याचे आदेश दिले. १५ वर्षे उलटून गेली, परंतु नगरविकास विभाग अद्याप त्याची अंमलबजावणी करत आहे, मुख्यमंत्र्यांनी आदेश दिल्यानंतर अॅक्शन टेकिंग प्लॅन तयार केलाच नाही, असे ते म्हणाले.

बाप्पाच्या आगमन, विसर्जन मार्गात पुलाचा धोका
